THE BEGINNING OF KNOWLEDGE

Hello there! Pastor here.

As we are gearing up once again for confirmation, I want to take a moment to speak to this really amazing thing we focus on in our church. Do you remember your confirmation? I bet you might remember a bit of the day of, but do you remember everything you learned in class? If you were given the same test today that you were given back then (if you were given a test), how would you do? Would you pass? Would you just barely skate by? Would you be embarrassed if you, like our confirmands, were given that test in front of others?

It is an often reiterated point that confirmation is not a graduation from church. This is a point I have tried to make for 12 years now, and it is one of the most ignored points that I teach (and to be honest that is really, really frustrating). But it isn't ignored because we have a ceremony, or because it is in May, or because all your family shows up. I honestly believe that it is ignored because people do not see the importance of being in God's Word in the first place. So many people want to do the bare minimum, and don't realize the importance of this task until way later. At that point, many people are intimidated or feel foolish or silly. This isn't just a young people problem, this is a multi-generational human problem.

So going back to the question I asked earlier, how would you feel if someone came up to you and asked you what you believe? Not as a confirmation event, but simply as a conversation with someone you know. Maybe even somebody you love. Perhaps a child or a grandchild. Would you impress upon them how important your faith is? Or would you be noncommittal about it?

Christian education is something I find to be more and more important each day, as the world grows further and further away from Christ. Christian education isn't just tests and questions and classes. It is a way of life. Our way of life. And yet so often we push it off as something for kids, or something that we tell ourselves we are too far away from to start now. But it is never too early or too late to start. So make time for devotions, every day. Go to Bible study. Go to multiple Bible studies. Listen in church. Pray with your family. Pray with your Church family. Make Christian education a priority and you will never be foolish. Not in God's eyes. Be nourished by the Holy Spirit in God's Word, and He will grow faith in you abundantly. It is important!



May 31—THE VISITATION (3-Year Lectionary)



Today Zechariah's house is prepared to sing: "The Lord God of Israel ... has visited and redeemed his people" (Luke 1:68). For the Scriptures are being fulfilled: "There shall come forth a shoot from the stump of Jesse, and a branch from his roots shall bear fruit" (Is. 11:1). What could raise a king from a dead line? Only the Lord Himself! This is no son of man's will, but the seed of the woman (Gen. 3:15). The Word of the Lord has done this, and so all are blessed in Him.

The "greeting" of blessed Mary causes John to leap in Elizabeth's womb (Luke 1:41). Both are delighted at what the Word has wrought: "Blessed is she who believed that there would be a ful-fillment of what was spoken to her from the Lord" (Luke 1:45).

Likewise we, too, "rejoice with those who rejoice" (Rom. 12:12– 15), for our joyful hope is in the Lord who has visited us to redeem us — not just a town in Judah but our entire fallen world.

The Holy Spirit discloses where salvation is to be found: in the most blessed fruit of Mary's blessed womb. And the whole Church rejoices, saying, "My beloved! Behold, he comes" (Song of Songs 2:8).





May 24—Esther

Esther is the heroine of the biblical book that bears her name. Her Jewish name was Hadassah, which means "myrtle." Her beauty, charm, and courage served her well as queen to King Ahasuerus. In that role she was able to save her people from the mass extermination that Haman, the king's chief advisor, had planned (2:19--4:17). Esther's efforts to uncover the plot resulted in the hanging of Haman on the very same gallows that he had built for Mordecai, her uncle and guardian. Then the king named Mordecai minister of state in Haman's place.



This story is an example of how God intervenes on behalf of his people to deliver them from evil, as here through Esther he preserved the Old Testament people through whom the Messiah would come


