Pastor's Corner



The Master of Virtue

Hello there! Pastor here.

This years Lenten topic on the Seven Deadly Sins has been a bit of a challenge for me. I have never much enjoyed focusing in on sin while preaching. While it is definitely an important part of our walk of faith, I have never much enjoyed talking about it. So going in depth has been a unique challenge for me. Particularly because each sermon has left me wishing I had more time to talk. And not just because I like to preach.

One thing that I really wish I could dive into more are the heavenly virtues that serve as direct foils to each deadly sin. As Peter says in the verses below, these virtues "keep us from being ineffective or unfruitful in the knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ." It is this sanctified living that I truly love to meditate on. How can we, as forgiven children of God, learn and grow? What habits can I develop that are better than the old sin-stained ones I run back to so quickly when bored, stressed, or hurting? What is the route that better brings me to being able to echo the sacrificial love my Lord has for me? Which we will see so beautifully this month on Good Friday.

Love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, & self-control, are goal posts that are worth training in, for they are the original acts we were created to exercise before sin brought its mucky net to ensnare us in what we should not do.

So while we may not have time to dive deep into these virtuous fruits of the Spirit on Wednesdays, we will get a wonderful opportunity to watch them in action during Holy Week. For the best way that we can learn is by watching the Master in action. For Jesus, the very embodiment of virtue and true master of all that is good, shows us these virtue's ultimate strength as He suffers and dies for us, without succumbing to the sin we so quickly run to.

So as we celebrate Holy Week this month, let us look to Jesus and His passion for us, and learn to love better.

For this very reason, make every effort to supplement your faith with virtue, and virtue with knowledge, and knowledge with self-control, and self-control with steadfastness, and steadfastness with godliness, and godliness with brotherly affection, and brotherly affection with love. For if these qualities are yours and are increasing, they keep you from being ineffective or unfruitful in the knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ. 2 Peter 1:5-8





As I sit in front of my computer preparing this article it seems like it was just the other day that I was writing the article for March. Individuals have told me that time flies by when you get older, they were not kidding! I find it more so when it comes to the Church Year.

We are already in the month of Easter, the glorious resurrection. Even though Easter is late this year it comes as Pastor Wagner and I find ourselves needing to quickly pull things together to prepare for this wonderful day. We are two thousand years past that first Easter and every year since that first Easter the Church has been preparing for this joy. But, what about before the first Easter.

Since Adam and Eve first sinned in the Garden of Eden and were cursed with death, God's people have looked forward to God's promise in the saving of their souls and the restoring of the decaying bodies. God proclaims that Satan would strike at the heal of Jesus, but Jusus would crush Satan's head (Gen 3:15). Throughout the Old Testament God established the sacrifice system for Israel's sins. In the New Testament Jesus is born leading a life that would take him to the cross where he would perfectly take our sins upon the cross and die with the wonderful words, "It is finished!" (John 19:30) It is on the cross that Jesus crushes the head of Satan as our sins are forever forgiven and our sins are remembered no more (Hebrews 8:12). Yet death would not be the end as Jesus rises from the dead three days later to destroy even death and give to us also the promise of the resurrection to eternal life! The last enemy to be destroyed is death (1 Corinthians 15:26). It is our Easter celebration!

We will be gathering this month for the gory and glory of Jesus' death on Good Friday. We then gather for the beauty of Easter morning as we celebrate that Jesus is alive. As Jesus lives, we too shall live eternally with him in heaven. The joy of all Scripture culminates in these two events as we witness once again the Father's love for us. The green of nature as we see it sprouting around us also reminds us of the new life we have in Jesus. We celebrate with a breakfast and Easter egg hunt. The events at our church on Easter are to bring into mind and remember how God is faithful to his Word. Yet, Easter is not just one celebration a year.

Every Sunday we gather with our brothers and sisters in Christ meeting on Sunday of every week, the first day of the week. Sunday is the day of the resurrection and we gather 52 times a year for that joy. Sunday becomes for us a remembrance of our new life through the death and resurrection of Jesus. Celebrate with us on Good Friday and Easter to strength our life and souls in the joy of what Jesus has given. Remember every Sunday is the comfort in the resurrection. Start every day in the certainty of your Baptism as we remember that we were buried with Christ in his death and raised to new life in his resurrection (Romans 6:4-7). We even are privileged to gather for the Lord's Supper twice a month as we receive the crucified Jesus, his body and blood, for the forgiveness of sins. Always a joy to gather!

Have you ever missed your turnoff? I am the queen of driving around the block because I missed my turn and this is exactly what happened to Orphan Grain Train staff and Pastor Ray Wilke when the GPS directive sent them to the wrong address in N.C. As it turned out, the address was of a house that was a total loss from floods. The owner of the house was a single mom and needed cancer treatments. A complete stranger had drove her to prior appointments but because of the flooding she had not seen him since. After learning of her struggles, Pastor Wikle, on behalf of OGT, gave her a check for \$1,000. The OGT crew went back later and Pastor Wilke gave Tina (the owner) an additional check for \$10,000 to help with expenses she was facing with the loss of her home, medical bills, and a car that was needing some TLC too. God always has a plan.

Also recently, OGT was able to send Texas thousands of pounds of various foods. As you can assume, they were very grateful. OGT provides food for kids meals, school furnishings and supplies, medical equipment and other aid. They help feed those living in poverty or who were part of a disaster by shipping Manna Meals or Mercy Meals. They don't forget items like formula, diapers, hygiene products, or a special motorized wheelchair for that child in need.

Yes, God has a plan. On the first Sunday of each month, we encourage you to bring in gently used clothes, shoes, household items, and unwanted medical equipment. There is a new detailed Wishlist by the LWML table. We also can donate directly.

Most importantly, OGT needs your prayers to help with this ministry. Your contributions make a big difference to someone who has lost everything.






CTK DONATION STATION

Do you like knowing where to bring your extra note pads, cards, calendars, and eyeglasses?



CTK, in connection with our LWML, has become a faithful contact for the many organizations we support.



The <u>Portals of Prayer</u> for Apr-Jun 2025 are here. As you pick up a new copy, put your past issues in the marked bin.

Getting too many <u>cards</u>, <u>note pads</u>, <u>calendars</u>? Drop-off any that are unwanted in the Donation Station. Carol Boldenow will take them to local nursing homes for residents to use. What may seem small to us — a birthday or holiday card to give another resident, a note pad for jotting down items needed or writing a note (if able) — may mean the world to others.



Carol will also take along the **motel items** from your recent trip.

Did you just get new glasses? Or find a pair in a drawer that you forgot you had? Drop them off and Tammy Taylor will make sure they reach MOST Ministries. Once there, used glasses are cleaned, sorted, tested and repacked for "recycling" on one of their short-term mission trips. MOST Ministries accepts **gently-used** <u>adult and child-sized glasses</u>, <u>readers</u> and <u>non-prescription sunglasses</u>. Unfortunately, more than 158 million people worldwide suffer uncorrected vision, a number that has



increased by 5 million since January 2023. Many of these people cannot afford to buy glasses. The pair of glasses received through MOST Ministries may be the only glasses some will ever have.

Another bin is marked for **pop tabs** for Ronald McDonald House. The Ronald McDonald House takes them to recycling and the monies received are used for general operating expenses. Save them from soda, soup and other cans and Mary Nelson will take care of them for you.

All the bins are marked, so please continue bringing in note pads, greeting cards, card fronts, eyeglasses, pop tabs and Portals of Prayer.
