Selfishly enjoying this February. Glad that January has come and gone, and looking forward towards Lent & Easter that is coming next month. I as a pastor really appreciate when Easter comes later, as it is nice to get a bit of a breather between Christmas & Lent. It is also a major month of birthdays for our family. 3 out of 4 Wagner's celebrate a birthday this month. And I got a big one coming. 40 years. Like most birthdays, it's a big number for those younger than you. And a smaller number for those older than you. But I'm looking forward to it!

Since I've got the number 40 on the brain, I'd figure I'd talk a bit about the number as it shows up in scripture. Forty shows up quite a lot as a measure of time. Forty days and nights the flood waters raged with Noah. Forty years did the people of God roam the wilderness. Forty days did Goliath torment Israel. Forty days Jesus fasted and was tempted in the wilderness.

As you can see, the number 40 is often tied to times of testing or trial. A time in which endurance finds its limit. Where the struggle is real. That our sin brings struggle. Yet in all of that testing, God was there. And though the people's faith was tried, it also made the testing bearable.

When times are hard, it can seem like minutes can go on forever. But they do pass. The floods end. The people find their promised land. The giants are vanquished. God's Word endures. But it doesn't mean that it is going to be easy. Life with sin has never been easy. However, faith does trust that this is bearable. That with God, all things are possible. Even if I must wait 40 hours, 40 days, or 40 years. God can do a lot of things in 40 years. But know this. He will see you through. No matter what you are going through, He does love you. And you will endure.

February the month of Valentine's Day is always seen as the month of love. We focus on giving a gift to our significant other(s) that expresses our love for that person or persons. However, Scripture gives us a little different idea of what *true* love is. We find in 1 John (3:16), "This is how we know what love is: Jesus Christ laid down his life for us. And we ought to lay down our lives for our brothers." Scriptural love is defined by the death of Jesus on the cross for us and through faith we *love* our neighbors. Love for our neighbors is first the love that is expressed in the married love of a husband and wife and secondly it is our love for each other. It is a love that is different than the love that the world sees.

The world shows love in how it relates back to us. The world loves out of a selfishness goal in bringing honor, praise, and glory to us. The Bible identifies love as how it brings honor, praise, and glory to others. It is not self-seeking but rather the lifting-up of our brothers and sisters. Dr. Martin Luther wonderfully and masterfully describes it as:

Man, however, needs none of these things for righteousness and salvation. Therefore, he should be guided in all his works by this thought and contemplate this one thing alone, that he may serve and benefit others in all that he does, considering nothing except the need and the advantage of his neighbor. Accordingly, the Apostle commands us to work with our hands so that we may give to the needy, although, he might have said that we should work to support ourselves. He, [the Apostle] says, however, "that he may be able to give to those in need [Eph 4:28]. This is what makes caring for the body a Christian work, to acquire, and lay by funds with which may serve the weaker, and we may be sons of God, each caring for and working for the other, bearing one another's burdens and so fulfilling the law of Christ [Gal 6:2]. This is a truly Christian life. Here faith is truly active through love [Gal 5:6], that is, it finds expression in works of the freest service, cheerfully and lovingly done, with which a man willingly serves another without hope of reward; and for himself he is satisfied with the fullness and wealth of his faith. (*The Freedom of a Christian*, Luther 1520)

As those who are redeemed by the blood of Christ on the cross, we work to love each other not out of a sense of reward but rather because all righteousness has already been granted to us. Let us strive to love one another as Christ has loved us.

As the Lenten season is now just a little over a month away, we wanted to give you the opportunity to decide what theme we will meditate on. This year, we have three options:



<u>Modern Sin</u>. The 7 deadly sins have always been the enemy and struggle of God's people, but how do they rear their ugly heads in our modern world? How can we better combat the constant pressure of these evils?



Endure. Based on the LCMS National Youth Gathering's theme for this summer, we will look at how to endure the race marked out for us. There are lots of trials we encounter in our walk of faith. How do we learn the endurance to bear on?



Spiritual Disciplines. In this theme, we go to the Teacher to learn better how to master the disciplines of faith. How do we pray? Forgive? Meditate? Endure temptation? Jesus' teachings are more than just words to make us feel better. They are Spiritual Disciplines we can put into action.

SANCTUARY NEW SEATING AND FLOORING

The new seating/flooring committee has met and will be making a presentation at the February 2, 2025, Voter's meeting.

We have proposals on materials and installation of flooring and seating. We will be discussing what type of seating we want and will present a proposal for flooring so we can move forward with getting firm proposals and installation dates.

We have 2 options for seating – individual locking chairs or conventional pews. Because of the discussion on the chairs, we will have a sample of the chairs we would purchase locally from Design Central in the Fellowship Hall for a few days prior to the meeting and will keep them for another week so everyone has an opportunity to see what we are proposing. The conventional pews are like what we currently have with padded seats and backs made of solid oak.

All the proposals that we have require 50% down at time of order with remainder being paid at time of installation. This would mean we have all our fund raising completed before we enter into any agreement with these companies.

OGT has given Pastor Frese \$50,000.00 to share. \$1,000.00 checks are being given to families that have lost everything. The Survival Money is for use on immediate needs such as hotel, food, toiletries, etc. Please pray for these families that have lost so much and are living in uncertainty.



In the past weeks we have seen many pictures like this as we watch our televisions. Many homes and businesses were destroyed and as I am writing this article the fire is not completely under control. 


CTK DONATION STATION

The **<u>Portals of Prayer</u>** for Jan-Mar 2025 are here. As you pick up a new copy, put your past issues in the marked bin.

Getting too many <u>cards</u>, <u>note pads</u>, <u>calendars</u>? Drop-off any that are unwanted in the Donation Station. Carol Boldenow will take them to local nursing homes for residents to use. What may seem small to us — a birthday or holiday card to give another resident, a note pad for jotting down items needed or writing a note (if able) — may mean the world to others.



Carol will also take along the motel items from your recent trip.

Did you just get new glasses? Or find a pair in a drawer that you forgot you had? Drop them off and Tammy Taylor will make sure they reach MOST Ministries. Once there, used glasses are cleaned, sorted, tested and repacked for "recycling" on one of their short-term mission trips. MOST Ministries accepts **gently-used** <u>adult and child-sized glasses</u>, <u>readers</u> and <u>non-prescription sunglasses</u>. Unfortunately, more than 158 million people worldwide suffer uncorrected vision, a number that has



increased by 5 million since January 2023. Many of these people cannot afford to buy glasses. The pair of glasses received through MOST Ministries may be the only glasses some will ever have.

Another bin is marked for **<u>pop tabs</u>** for Ronald McDonald House. The Ronald McDonald House takes them to recycling and the monies received are used for general operating expenses. Save them from soda, soup and other cans and Mary Nelson will take care of them for you.

All the bins are marked, so please continue bringing in note pads, greeting cards, card fronts, eyeglasses, pop tabs and Portals of Prayer.
