Orphan Grain Train +

Orphan Grain Train has been busy since my last article.

During mid-September, OGT held their convention in Norfolk, NE and dedicated their new Servants Center on the same weekend. This additional space will give them more room to store donations, a room to make Mercy Meals, a training/media room, as well as increase the parking for volunteers, and make it easier to bring in donations and ship. With the Servants Center's additional space, OGT feels they will be able to increase the amount of shipping of food, clothing, and other needed items more efficiently.



Then came Hurricane Helene. OGT is working with a LCMS congregation at Ashville, NC to bring in water and supplies. On Oct. 4th the first load of supplies was sent to Ashville. Ashville also requested OGT's portable kitchen, their shower, and bedroom units, included in this are some laundry units. These units will assure the workers and those in distress will have some food, water and showers. Ashville is requesting Hygiene Kits and disaster clean up buckets. These 5-gallon buckets hold cleaning items as well as a N-95 mask. At this time, I am aware of 2 tankers, that hold 5,300 gallons, that have been sent to help with showers and flushing. I would encourage you to follow Orphan Grain Train on Facebook to keep up to date.

Thrivent is also matching funds to help with the hurricane effort. For every \$2.00 you contribute online, they will match and give a \$1.00. Just go to the Orphan Grain Train website, scroll down and click on the box that says Thrivent Match for Hurricane Helene.

One of the things that has been emphasized in that class is that the commands that God gives us will be realized in the new creation. When God says that we ought to love Him with all our heart, mind, and strength, He is also saying that in the new creation we will love Him with all our heart, mind and strength. This has provided me with a new lens to read the Old Testament through.

The biggest change this semester has been the addition of my daughter Annette Lynn Christensen to my family. I like to joke that I always knew in my head how hard it is to have a baby, but I never knew in my heart how hard it is to have a baby. Annette was born on August 1st at 4:20 am. My wife and I have been blessed greatly by God because she gets to have maternity leave through this entire semester.

Lately, I have been really pondering Philippians 2:3 - "3 Do nothing from selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility count others more significant than yourselves" (ESV). Paul is suggesting something that radically departs from our traditional way of thinking. What does it mean to count others as more significant than ourselves? I think Paul is telling us that we should be willing to help others even if it is to our own detriment. Our example of this can be found in Jesus Christ, who, as Paul writes a couple of verses later, made Himself servant of all even though He had the power to be the Lord of all. This passage has caused me to think about how I ought to view others in every relationship friends, family, coworkers, and strangers.

Lastly, I want to thank you for all of your support. It has been a blessing to be able to attend the seminary this fall. This second year has provided me with a lot of food for thought, and I appreciate the opportunity to learn what it means to proclaim the Gospel.




CTK DONATION STATION

Do you like knowing where to bring your extra note pads, cards, calendars, and eyeglasses?



This also makes it easy for the wonderful ladies who spend time dropping off, sorting, trimming and touching base with the many places in Salina that appreciate getting the Portals of Prayer devotional books, note pads, or cards for their residents to use or send to a friend.

CTK, in connection with our LWML, has become a faithful contact for the many organizations we support.



The **<u>Portals of Prayer</u>** for Oct-Dec 2024 are here. As you pick up a new copy, put your past issues in the marked bin.

Getting too many <u>cards</u>, <u>note pads</u>, <u>calendars</u>? Drop-off any that are unwanted in the Donation Station. Carol Boldenow will take them to local nursing homes for residents to use. What may seem small to us — a birthday or holiday card to give another resident, a note pad for jotting down items needed or writing a note (if able) — may mean the world to others.



Carol will also take along the motel items from your recent trip.

Did you just get new glasses? Or find a pair in a drawer that you forgot you had? Drop them off and Tammy Taylor will make sure they reach MOST Ministries. Once there, used glasses are cleaned, sorted, tested and repacked for "recycling" on one of their short-term mission trips. MOST Ministries accepts **gently-used** <u>adult and child-sized glasses</u>, <u>readers</u> and <u>non-prescription sunglasses</u>. Unfortunately, more than 158 million people worldwide suffer uncorrected vision, a number that has



increased by 5 million since January 2023. Many of these people cannot afford to buy glasses. The pair of glasses received through MOST Ministries may be the only glasses some will ever have.

Another bin is marked for **<u>pop tabs</u>** for Ronald McDonald House. The Ronald McDonald House takes them to recycling and the monies received are used for general operating expenses. Save them from soda, soup and other cans and Mary Nelson will take care of them for you.

All the bins are marked, so please continue bringing in note pads, greeting cards, card fronts, eyeglasses, pop tabs and Portals of Prayer.
